Scratch Workshop



Scratch is a form of coding. At the core of Scratch is a graphical programming language that lets you control the actions and interactions among different media. Coding in Scratch is much easier than in traditional programming languages: to create a script, you simply snap together graphical blocks, much like LEGO bricks or puzzle pieces.

“Scratch is designed with learning and education in mind. As young people create and share projects in Scratch, they develop important design and problem-solving skills, learning how to think creatively, reason systematically, and work collaboratively.

Scratch can be used in many different settings: schools, museums, community centers, and homes. It is intended especially for 8- to 16-year-olds, but younger children can work on Scratch projects with their parents or older siblings, and college students use Scratch in some introductory computer science classes”

Patricia Overton Hand Crochet

A passion for crochet and craftwork

'Today is the start of the rest of my life' . . . that's what I said in 2005 when I finally returned to Ireland following a career spanning almost forty years, in the UK.

As a child in Ireland, I loved making things out of *nothing!* It is a passion that stayed with me throughout my adult life. My mother was a dedicated crocheter – she was taught the craft as a young child in the 1920s. I inherited my mother's love of crochet and she nurtured it in me.

THE 'TEE-SHIRT YARN' WORKSHOPS

Reuse, recycle: Turn that old, unloved tee-shirt into a creative yarn.

Tee-shirt yarn is the *'new kid on the block'* – it is produced using the end cuts of factory tee-shirt manufacture. It is wound onto spools and sold commercially as a yarn for knitting, crocheting & weaving. *BUT*, you can create your own yarn by using any old tee-shirt! By following a few simple steps, using a scissors, a steady hand, under my instruction, you will create a continuous piece of yarn that can be used in many, creative ways, resulting in endless possibilities.
