The following is the pitch that got us to the top 25. It was written by a member of Louisburgh HQ Catherine Duffy.

Louisburgh even sounds exotic. It is situated only 12 miles from Westport (recently nominated as the Best Place to live in Ireland). Louisburgh is the place where Westport people go on their holidays. It is nestled under Croagh Patrick on the edge of Clew Bay just where the calm waters hit the Wild Atlantic.

Take a swim in one of the 2 blue flag beaches in Clew Bay or surf in Carrownisky (on the Atlantic side) which is one of the 3 beaches that are prized for their natural, unspoilt environment. Carrownisky is a surfer's paradise. If you will not venture to stand up on a board– you can lie on a board and be carried to the shore by a wave. Gather at Carrowmore or Old Head for pier jumping at full tide these piers are like giant natural swimming pools – my friend Mimi says "no spa could compare with this". Louisburgh has an amazing selection of craftspeople. Over 30 local crafts people sell beautiful items in Duffy's craft shop. These include jewellery, paintings, textiles, hats and tea cosies. Call into Durkans' foodstore to get freshly made breads and scones, stand still and enjoy the welcoming chat which were always part of rural live and are still in abundance here. On Fridays the local producers bring their fare to market and you can purchase fresh eggs, preserves, salad, vegetables and fish. During the summer the fish is often for free – call down to Old Head and the fishermen are often trying to offload their mackerel - eaten straight out of the sea they taste exotic. JP, in the butcher's shop, is renowned for his Mayo Mountain Lamb and all his meat is locally sourced: a real treat these days.

Stroll down through the streets of the town, wander down to Louisburgh 74 for a delicious crab salad during the day, or in the evening take your choice from the family seafood bistro of Orla Gaffney, the American style diner Surf n Turf or the award-winning Hudson's Pantry - there is a dining experience there for everyone."

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You will surely find a session in one of the local pubs and you will soon have friends here. It is easy to work up an appetite for this welcome and food, by climbing Croagh Patrick which is 762 metres above sea level and see the 365 islands in Clew Bay. Take a cycle to Delphi House or Delphi Adventure Centre and appreciate the breathtaking scenery. Delphi is alongside one of the few natural fjords (The Killary Fjord) in the World. It is here that the annual famine walk takes place. Take the boat to the Islands from Roonagh Pier - this will surely whet your appetite.

Louisburgh HQ, run by volunteers has many activities organised for you-such as foraging, jewellery making, film nights, walks and talks.

For the painter, the pilgrim, the photographer, the forager, the fisherman, the foodie, the walker, the geologist, the historian and the child there is no better place.
